Continuing to Protect the Native Vote

In addition to having the ability to ork on ICWA cases here in Colorado, students of the clinic and the American Indian Law Program have the continuing opportunity to engage with Indigenous communities, organizations, and tribes in other parts of the country.

In Fall 2024, the American Indianal Clinic will continue its longstanding tradition of engaging in voting rights work during an election year. Starting in 2018, the AILC has sought to work with Indigenous-led organizations to provide resources and support so that every Native individual who wants to cast a ballot is able to do so.

In 2020 and 2022, stedts parsed all 50 states' voting laws to provide Native-specific resources about how to vote. In 2022, students also worked to support ongoing voting work in North Dakota by providing Election Day poll watching.
