## Debo P. Adegbile

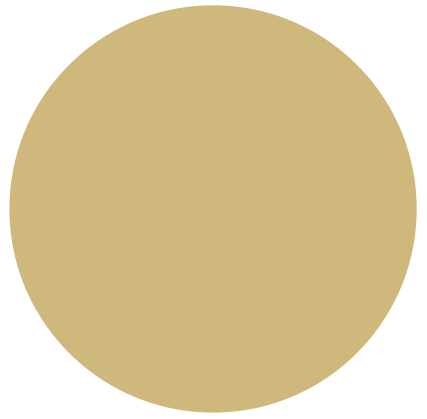

Debo P. Adegbile, Chair of the firm's Anti-Discrimination Practice, focuses on a range of matters at the intersection of law, business, and government policy. He has considerable experience representing companies assessing environmental, social, and governance strategies. He has represented clients in commercial, government-facing, trial and appellate litigation, including in the successful defense of Harvard University's admissions policies and practices at trial and on appeal in *SFFA v. Harvard*. He also provides strategic counseling in high-stakes cases, anti-discrimination matters and investigations. He has served as counsel to clients on fair lending compliance and enforcement matters, including the representation of a large financial institution in the resolution of a DOJ race discrimination investigation. Debo has extensive experience advising corporations in connection with civil rights audits and assessments and providing representation in high-stakes cases and investigations. Most recently, Debo led the Google civil rights audit. Debo is a member of WilmerHale's Global Management Committee, Partner Compensation Committee, and firmwide Executive Diversity and Inclusion Committee. In addition to his practice at the firm, Debo recently completed a six-year term as a commissioner on the US Commission on Civil Rights, appointed by President Obama. Prior to joining the firm, Debo spent more than a decade litigating cases for the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, Inc., where he served in several leadership roles. At LDF, Debo argued significant civil rights cases in the US Supreme Court (including *Shelby County v. Holder*, and *Northwest Austin Municipal Utility District No. 1 v. Holder*). He also previously served as senior counsel to the Chair of the US Senate Judiciary Committee.

Debo has testified before Congress several times as an expert on civil rights law and legislation. He chairs the Board of Trustees of Connecticut College and sits on the Boards of NYU School of Law and the Vera Institute of Justice, of which he is Vice Chair. In addition, he serves on the Advisory Council for the Center for Democracy and Technology and the advisory board of the Policing Project at NYU School of Law. He has received several advocacy and public service recognitions.

Kyriaki "Kiki" Council (she/her/hers) is Legal Counsel for Pro Bono Initiatives at the Lawyering Project, where she helps to coordinate the Abortion Defense Network. Kiki strives to secure every human's legal and social rights to autonomy over healthcare choices for their bodies. Prior to joining The Lawyering Project, Kiki worked as a Staff Attorney at The Forefront Project, an organization dedicated to providing pro bono legal services to reproductive rights, health, and justice (RRHJ) organizations across the United States that engage in advocacy work at the local, state, and/or federal level. Outside of the Lawyering Project, Kiki's pro bono practice focuses on representing Colorado minors who are seeking abortion care without forced parental involvement in judicial bypass petitions.

In 2022, Kiki worked alongside advocates at Cobalt Advocates and the Colorado Organization for Latina Opportunity and Reproductive Rights (COLOR) to draft and ultimately pass Colorado's Reproductive Health Equity Act. Kiki's steadfast dedication to the RRHJ movement has been recognized by several organizations. In 2022, she was awarded Champion of Choice by Planned Parenthood of the Rocky Mountains, Warrior for Justice by the Sam Cary Bar Association, and Gary L McPherson Outstanding Young Attorney of the Year by the Colorado Bar Association.

Before fully dedicating her legal practice to RRHJ, Kiki clerked on the United States Court of Appeals for the 10th Circuit and practiced labor and employment defense at private law firms. She received her Bachelor of Arts from the University of Chicago and her Juris Doctor from the University of Colorado Law School.

Dean Rebecca Rebouché is the Beasley Professor of Law and the

James E. Beasley Professor of Law. Prior to her appointment as Dean, she was the Associate Dean for Research, a position she held from 2017 to 2021. She is also a Faculty Fellow at Temple's Center for Public Health Law Research.

Dean Rebouché is a leading scholar in reproductive health law and family law. She is an author of [Reproductive Health Law](#) and an editor of [Family Law](#).

She is also the editor of [The Law of Reproductive Health and Family Law](#), published by Cambridge University Press, and an author of the sixth edition of the casebook, [Reproductive Health Law](#). In addition, she will join the fifth edition of the casebook, [Family Law](#), and recently co-edited a collection of essays for [The Law of Reproductive Health and Family Law](#) on the pandemic's effects on contract law.

Dean Rebouché has served as a co-investigator on two grant-funded research projects related to reproductive health, one housed at the Emory University Rollins School of Public Health and another funded by the World Health Organization. Her research interests include abortion law, relational contracts, gestational surrogacy, prenatal genetic testing and genetic counseling, collaborative divorce, parental involvement laws, and international reproductive rights.

Dean Rebouché received a B.S. from Harvard Law School, an LL.M. from Queen's University, and a Ph.D. in Law from Trinity University. Prior to law school, she worked as a researcher for the Northern Ireland Human Rights Commission.
